GUIDELINES FOR CHAPERONES

Thank you for volunteering your time as a chaperone for the retreat at Marelo Youth Retreat Center.

- Chaperones are the primary contacts and mentors for youth attending retreats.
- Chaperones are the first line in promoting and protecting the health, safety, and well-being of the youth that participate. It is every chaperone's duty to be a reliable, positive role model.
- Chaperones must be at least 21 years of age or at least 3 years older than the youth they are chaperoning, whichever is greater.
- It is the responsibility of all retreating organizations to conduct background checks on the chaperones attending with youth per the guidelines and policies set forth by the Diocese of Sacramento in accordance the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People.

Chaperone function:

- To support the teachers, and core lead/retreat director, by providing adult supervision and guidance to the students/retreatants throughout the retreat;
- To promote a positive atmosphere of fun and camaraderie among the students;
- To ensure the students' safety by enforcing rules and policies set forth by Marelo Youth Retreat Center in its General Policies document found on its Web site at: <http://www.marelloyrc.org/retreats/policies>
- To ensure the students have basic necessities like water and restroom breaks;
- To ensure that your group leaves the facility and premises as clean as it was upon arrival;
- To help the students work through any problems that arise and to facilitate solutions.
- To assist any and all students in a group.
- Chaperones are responsible for youth whereabouts at all times, and supervision of youth is required throughout the entire retreat whether structured sessions, or "free time" activities.
